Appeal Letter Writing: How to Invite Generosity



- Think person, not purse. Tell how lives are changed by the ministry of your church and how the reader's gift will make a difference.
- Focus on the narrative, not the numbers. Giving is emotional, so appeal to the reader's heart. Rather than saying, "An average of 225 people come to our community dinners so we need more funds for food", include a quote from a dinner attendee or tell the story of someone who comes that shows how the dinner has impacted him or her.
- Be clear and direct. Keep the letter to one page. Use short paragraphs and language that's easy to understand. Avoid technical terms.
- Include a call to action. Tell the reader what you want him or her to do, and what will happen as a result. "If you make a gift today, it will help us feed more children tomorrow."
- Give the reader options. If you're asking for a monetary gift, include a response envelope. Share how the reader can give online or through an automatic bank draft. Consider whether the appeal is one to which someone would make a gift of stock or distribution from an IRA; if so, include information on how to give utilizing those methods.
- Use a postscript. Research shows readers pay attention to the "P.S.", so use it wisely. Reiterate your call to action, share a deadline, or highlight another way a gift will help the church strengthen its ministries.
- Consider targeting your letters. Someone who gives every year should be thanked for their past generosity, whereas someone who has never made a financial gift to the church should be challenged to take that first step.
